



In recent days Jocab Zuma, president of the ANC's regime in southern Africa, visited Orania, an Afrikaner small town in the Northern Cape. He was welcomed by Professor Carel Boshoff (83 y.o.), founder of the small community, pass off - for years - as the embryo of an independent Afrikaner state.
